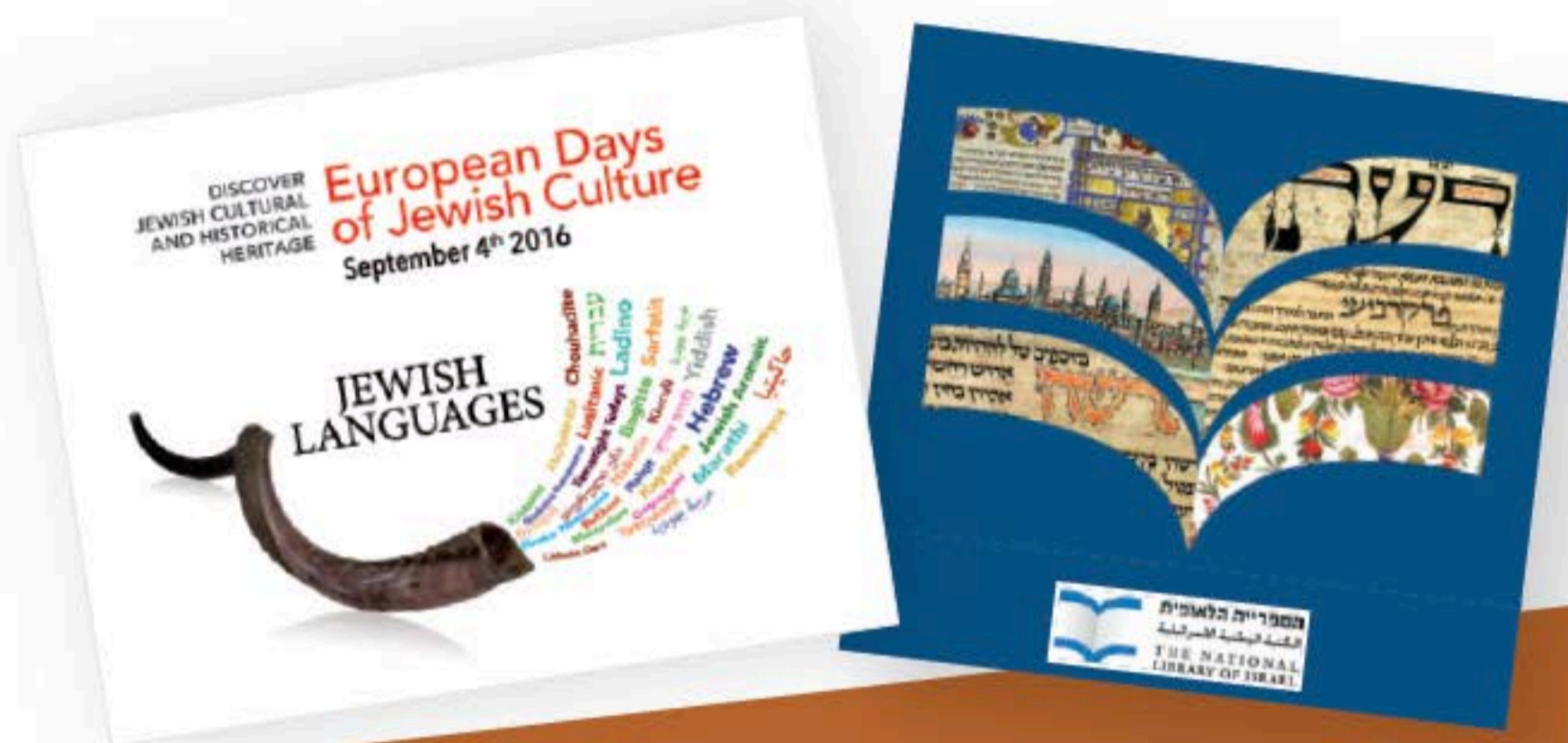


EUROPEAN DAYS OF JEWISH CULTURE

The European Day of Jewish Culture 2016 (EDJC) has become a truly pan-European event, and is now celebrated simultaneously in more than 30 different European countries in more than 300 cities. In total, it carried out nearly 900 activities which have received more than 169.000 visitors which increases year after year.



Cooperation with National Library of Israel

AEPJ and NLI set up a pilot project in 2016 about the topic of the year. A research on “Jewish Languages” was carried out and an exhibit was provided to all participants, giving room and encouraging them to show their local objects and to tell their local stories about it. 2017 topic will be about “Diaspora” under the same partnership.

EUROPEAN ROUTES OF JEWISH HERITAGE

The European Route of Jewish Heritage currently involves 16 countries; France, United Kingdom, Portugal, Spain, Czech-Republic, Lithuania, Italy, Switzerland, Azerbaijan and Georgia, joined in 2015; Turkey, Germany, Ireland, Poland, Slovakia, Austria, joined in 2016; in 2017, we expect Romania and other countries to join us.



Each country has developed its national route of Jewish heritage that will be then part of a unique European transnational route.

In addition, there are three thematic routes: Architectural Modernism in European Synagogues / Women in Judaism / The Wooden Synagogues of Central and Eastern Europe.
